SALARIES AND COMPENSATION

ARTICLE I

Board of Supervisors

§ 42-1. Compensation established. [Amended 12-28-1995 by Ord. No. 112]

Each Supervisor of West Earl Township taking office by election or appointment after January 1, 1996, shall receive compensation for attending duly advertised meetings or executive sessions of the Board of Supervisors and performing other duties as a member of the Board of Supervisors at the rate of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.) per annum.

§ 42-2. Compensation limited by statute. [Amended 12-28-1995 by Ord. No. 112]

- A. No Supervisor shall receive annual compensation under this Article in excess of the annual statutory limit set by the General Assembly in Act 60 of 1995¹ for Supervisors of second class townships within the appropriate population category.
- B. Members of the Board of Supervisors whose terms of office commenced after January 1, 1993, but prior to January 1, 1996, shall receive compensation in accordance with Ordinance No. 101 of the township, enacted August 9, 1993. Members of the Board of Supervisors whose terms of office commenced prior to January 1, 1993, shall receive compensation in accordance with Ordinance No. 51 of the township, enacted December 9, 1985.²

§ 42-3. Payment of compensation.

Such compensation shall be paid in monthly installments.

§ 42-4. Performance of other township services; additional compensation.

The salary to be paid each Supervisor pursuant to this Article is considered compensation

for services rendered by the Supervisor for the duties imposed by law on Supervisors of second class townships. Should a Supervisor perform services for the township while acting as a Superintendent, Road Master or laborer, the Supervisor shall be entitled to such additional compensation as is determined by the Township Board of Auditors. However, no Supervisor shall receive compensation as a Superintendent or Road Master for the time he or she spends attending a meeting of the Board of Supervisors.
