Utility Billing Changes

The West Earl Township office staff would like to thank you for your patience during the transition to monthly utility billing. You have been supportive of our efforts to make this change and achieve our goal to simplify payments to our office.

This change in billing required many steps. The monthly notifications that were sent out were intended to keep you abreast of the process. We are pleased to report that everything is on schedule and the next bills in May will be combined.



- \Rightarrow Rates for all utilities remain the same. The only difference is the frequency of the invoice.
- \Rightarrow Once all bills are combined onto one invoice, you may write one check for the total amount due.
- ⇒ The combined bills will be printed on white paper. Please don't mistake them for Junk-mail!



Storm Water Pollution Solutions

Storm water runoff and why it's a problem.

Storm water runoff occurs when precipitation from rain or snowmelt flows over the ground. Impervious surfaces like driveways, sidewalks, and streets prevent storm water from naturally soaking into the ground. Storm water can pick up debris, chemicals, dirt, and other pollutants and flow into a storm sewer system or directly to a lake, stream, river, wetland, or coastal water. Anything that enters a storm sewer system is discharged untreated into the waterbodies we use for swimming, fishing, and providing drinking water.

The effects of storm water pollution

Polluted storm water runoff can have many adverse effects on plants, fish, animals, and people.

- Debris—plastic bags, six-pack rings, bottles, and cigarette butts—washed into water bodies can choke, suffocate, or disable aquatic life like ducks, fish, turtles, and birds.
- Household hazardous wastes like insecticides, pesticides, paint, solvents, used motor oil, and other
 - auto fluids can poison aquatic life. Land animals and people can become sick or die from eating diseased fish and shellfish or ingesting polluted water.
- Polluted storm water often affects drinking water sources. This, in turn,

can affect human health and increase drinking water treatment costs.

10 Things You Can Do to Prevent Storm Water Runoff Pollution

- Use fertilizers sparingly and sweep up driveways, sidewalks, and gutters.
- * Never dump anything down storm drains or in streams.
- * Vegetate bare spots in your yard.
- Compost your yard waste. Township residents can use the compost facility located on Locust Street in Talmage free of charge.
- * Use less toxic pesticides, follow labels, and learn how to prevent pest problems.
- Direct downspouts away from paved surfaces; consider a rain garden to capture runoff.
- Take your car to the car wash instead of washing it in the driveway.
- * Check your car for leaks and recycle your motor oil. The Township office has a receptacle for recycling used motor oil.
- * Pick up after your pet.
- Have your septic tank pumped and system inspected regularly.



Did you know that Pennsylvania passed a law, called the Covered Devices Recycling Act, which prohibits residents from disposing of covered devices as trash? Effective January 24, 2013 residents and businesses may no longer place these items at the curb or throw them away as trash. These devices must be recycled. Additionally, trash haulers are prohibited from collecting these items as municipal waste.
