WHITE GOODS & TIRE PICK-UP

Saturday, April 13th, 2019

The contracted township trash hauler will be around to collect tires and white goods on Saturday, April 13th. If you have old tires or appliances that you are looking to get rid of, this is the time to do so. You must be a current township trash/recycling customer to participate. Each tire must have an orange tag (\$2/tag) and each white goods item must have a blue tag (\$12/tag). You can pick up tags at the township office weekdays between 8 AM and 4 PM. Tags must be purchased <u>before</u> Thursday, April 11th. Please make sure to place your items out for pick-up Friday night (haulers will start early on Saturday morning).

Spring Cleaning for Old Technology

Instead of trashing your old devices, recycle them and you may get a little something extra in return. If you're doing some spring cleaning, don't throw your old phones, batteries, bulbs or computers away.

Apple stores will take your old products and, in some cases, you'll receive a gift card or credit. Dell also offers credits for trade-ins of old electronics. Samsung does recycling through www.oemtakeback.com, where you can print a free return shipment label.

If you have rechargeable batteries or cords, take them to a recycling kiosk inside Best Buy stores. Best Buy and Staples will also accept large e-waste items. CFL bulbs can be dropped off at the West Earl Township office.

You cannot place any electronic devices in your normal trash receptacle so the tips listed above may help to clear up that clutter. You may also want to try www.recyclewhere.org to find nearby drop-off sites. Some charities like Medic Mobile and FreeGeek will also take electronics for recycling; either to refurbish or to fund new phones for their projects.

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WEST EARL LIONS PARK RENTAL

With warmer weather coming, you may be starting to plan some outdoor activities for 2019. If you are looking for an inexpensive and local setting, the West Earl Lions Park may be just what you're looking for. It is still only \$50 to rent the pavilion for the day. Located in Talmage, it is the perfect place for family get-togethers, picnics and any other gatherings.

The pavilion is available for rent from mid-April through the end of October. Dates fill up quickly, so call the township office if you are looking for a specific date.

The West Earl Township office will be closed on Friday, April 19th in observation of the Easter holiday. The office will reopen at 8 AM on Monday, April 22nd.

COMPOST SITE UPDATE

As of January 7, 2019, the rates for the West Earl Township Compost site are as follows:

Township Residents - \$1.00 per trip for the first 20 visits; \$10 a trip for any add'tl trips Non-Township Residents - \$20.00 per trip Commercial Customers - \$50.00 per trip Replacement Cards - \$5.00 per card

If you still have trips remaining on your compost card, they are to be used before paying the new rates for compost trips. Once your card no longer has any trips left on it, you will have to stop in to the township office and add more.

The West Earl Township trash hauler will begin collecting yard waste on Tuesday, April 2nd. You must be a current township trash & recycling customer to be eligible for this service. The township has yard waste bags for sale at the township office. They are still only \$1.00 per bag. We will accept tree trimmings, plant debris from flower beds and gardens, shrubbery clippings, weeds, leaves & limited amounts of grass clippings. All of the items we accept are naturally growing plants that can biodegrade. Trash, litter, plastic film and pots, sod, stones & glass are not permitted. We use your yard waste to produce mulch that residents can use, so please do not contaminate it.

Earth-Friendly Spring Cleaning

Spring means time to declutter, reduce & recycle. Here are some tips to help you out:

- If you cannot remember the last time an item was used, or you forgot that you even had it, you may want to pass that item on
- Can that old chair be refinished or reupholstered? Can those pieces of fabric be used as rags? Try to find new ways to use old or outdated items.
- If you think an item has value, try to sell it on a garage sale site. You can also donate items to local clothing drives or Goodwill.
- Aim for zero waste. While spring cleaning, try to use old or washable towels instead of paper towels that just get discarded.

West Earl Township Refuse & Recycling

West Earl Township has an ordinance stating that all residential dwellings in the township MUST have a contracted trash hauler. The hauler does not have to be the one that West Earl uses, but it must be a contracted hauler that we can contact to verify information. The only exceptions to this ordinance are farms that are over 10 acres and those residents who have filled out, returned and had their trash exemption sheets approved by the board of supervisors.

If a septic tank fails, raw wastewater can pond on individual properties, exposing families and pets to life-threatening pathogens. Septic systems are very much like automobiles: they need periodic inspections and proper maintenance to continue working properly. They must be operated properly & not overtaxed or the owner will suffer consequences such as paying to repair or replace the system.

• Test Your Well: If you're on a well, test the water annually.

You can start the maintenance process by doing a few simple things:

- Conserve water and reduce waste flow to the treatment tank
- Inspect the system parts regularly (once every three years is mandatory in West Earl Township)
 - Contract a licensed septic hauler to do all inspections and cleanings
- Maintain the treatment tank
- Utilize proper stormwater management to protect the system
- Do not plant trees or shrubs near the on-lot system
- Prevent stormwater from entering the treatment tank and distribution box/dosing tank
- Do not drive vehicles or heavy equipment over the drainfield
- Do not allow livestock to graze near the drainfield

Zoning/Building Permits and Minor Stormwater Site Plans

When applying for zoning or building permits one of the things that must be considered is whether your project will require the management of stormwater runoff.

Stormwater is the runoff produced by precipitation, snow melt, or ice melt. When land is developed or changed, the flow patterns of water, volume of water and quality of water are also changed. Land development activities can affect characteristics of stormwater runoff, including the rate of runoff, volume of runoff, and quality of runoff. When runoff is not managed, the increased volume may aggravate flooding. The objective of stormwater management is to prevent or mitigate the adverse impacts of the increase in rate and volume of stormwater runoff, while also protecting health, safety, and property.

Minor Stormwater Site Plans

A minor stormwater site plan is a designed, on-site stormwater management facility for regulated activities that are new, relatively minor residential and accessory structure projects that are less than 5,000 square feet. If your project is less than 1,000 square feet you may be eligible for an exemption from the stormwater management requirements depending on whether there have been any land development projects on the property since July 1, 2005.

Regulated Activities


The follow is a list of regulated activities.

- Earth disturbance that involves the alteration or development of land in a manner that may affect stormwater runoff.
- Land development that is subject to the Township's Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance.
- Removal of ground cover, grading, filling or excavation.
- Construction of new or additional impervious or semi-impervious surfaces (driveways, parking lots, etc) and associated improvements.
- Construction of new buildings or additions to existing buildings.
- Installation or alteration of stormwater management facilities.
- Diversion or piping of any watercourse.
- Any other regulated activities where the Township determines that such activities may affect any existing watercourse's stormwater management facilities, or stormwater drainage patterns.

Will my project require a minor stormwater site plan?

If your project includes regulated activities that (measured on a cumulative basis from July 1, 2005) create new impervious area of more than 1,000 square feet and less than 5,000 square feet or involve earth disturbance activity of an area less than 5,000 square feet and do not involve the alteration of stormwater facilities or watercourses then your project will require a minor stormwater site plan. Any projects that include new impervious area or earth disturbance of more than 5,000 square feet will require a full, stormwater management plan that has been designed by a qualified professional and may also require an Erosion & Sedimentation Control Plan issued by the Lancaster County Conservation District.

West Earl Township has developed a manual as a tool to help property owners in the designing process for minor stormwater site plans. Through this manual, residents have the ability to determine the appropriate facilities for their property, project and budget. West Earl Township has an ordinance stating that you must clean up after your pets while on public property.

"It shall be unlawful for the owner of any animal to allow such animal under his or her control to defile or defecate on any sidewalk, walkway or property of another. It shall be the duty of the person in control of an animal which defecates on any sidewalk, walkway or property of another to promptly clean up and remove all feces discharged and to dispose of such feces in a lawful and sanitary manner."

Please abide by this so we can all enjoy the public spaces that West Earl has to offer.

Know what's **below. Call** before you dig.

Virtually anywhere you need to dig, there are probably underground facilities somewhere in the vicinity. Growing networks of telephone cables, power lines and cable TV lines are joining the gas, water, sewer and petroleum pipes. The odds of an excavator moving something besides dirt are growing every day. Even if you see overhead lines that doesn't rule out the existence of buried power, television or telephone facilities. Many utility companies have long-term programs to weatherproof their plant by putting it underground. Both aerial and underground facilities may be in use during transitions. Some areas have overhead main lines with buried services going to the homes and other buildings. Even water-filled ditches and streams may have underground utilities in or under them.

If you are thinking about doing some excavation, please remember to have your contractor contact the One Call System. If you are planning to do the excavation yourself, you are responsible for that call. Never dig until you know exactly what is below you.

West Earl Township can not accept broken or damaged CFL light bulbs. If you have bulbs that have stopped working but are still intact, please drop them off at the township building. If you have bulbs that are broken, please place them in your regular trash container.
